- Your bank or card provider. If you have sent money or given away your card details, you should contact your bank or card provider immediately. They may be able to stop or reverse the transaction and secure your account.
- The Citizens Advice consumer helpline. This is a free and confidential service that can provide you with advice and support. Visit www.citizensadvice.org.uk or call for free 0808 223 1133.
- Norfolk Police. You should contact the police if a crime is happening now or has recently occurred. Visit Norfolk.police.uk or call 101.



Local Government reform Update

After reviewing our proposal for a three-way unity authority and the supporting evidence, as well as the other submitted proposals, the Government has recently completed consulting with the public on the options available. Please note this timeline is subject to change:

- Early 2026: Government makes a decision on how services will be delivered in the future
- Spring 2026: Necessary changes in legislation start to be made, concluding in the Autumn of 2026
- 2027: New authorities set up in shadow form, with elections in May 2027
- 2028: New authorities go live and take over from existing councils







Through the Church Window – Feb/March 2026

I am sure you are as conscious as I am that we live in strange and disturbing times. President Trump's policies have changed political and economic practices around the world.

In Europe most countries agree that it is time to increase our defence budgets. Terrorist attacks seem to occur with increasing frequency, as do violent attacks on our streets. Mass migration is a world-wide concern, with no clear answers but many strong opinions. The sense of "how things are" that we have taken for granted for most of our lives seems to be under increasing threat.

Underlining all this is a movement away from seeing God as connected and involved with the world. When we see God as detached and faith as unimportant, we are in peril. It seems to me that this is very much what is going on in our culture.

Some time ago, Melvin Bragg wrote a book to commemorate 400 years of the King James Bible. It described the passion of the early Bible translators, who believed that nothing was more important than that ordinary Christians should be able to read the Bible in their own language. The book is a reminder of just how much the King James Bible shaped the history, law and culture of the western world.

JRR Tolkien, who wrote 'The Lord of the Rings' was a very devout Roman Catholic who lived out his faith, as most of us do, in a quiet and undramatic way, but which permeated his family life, his career as an Oxford don, his friendships and the ways he unobtrusively served and helped others. He reminds me that you do not have to have a big, dramatic faith in order to make a difference.

As we arrive again on the threshold of Lent, you may want to consider what God is saying to you and explore the question of "how should we live?", remembering that God is not disconnected and remote but intimately and passionately engaged with the world and us. I wish you all a blessed Lent.

Firstly, I'd like to wish you all a Happy New Year! I hope you had a lovely Christmas and got to spend some time with family and loved ones. Typically, the snowy weather arrived just in time for the children to be back at school!

This term, all of our children will be taking part in Multicultural week from 19th January. During this week, each class will be learning about different places and cultures around the world. Alongside the learning in the classroom, the children will have the opportunity to taste foods from around the world during lunchtime from the world menu. There are foods from Australia, Spain, China, America and Morocco on the world menu and we are hoping that children will give some new foods a try.

We are embarking on a new maths programme in school, called Can Do Maths. The teachers have been trying out the new programme before Christmas and the feedback is that the children have increased participating during maths and it has been noticed that more children are believing that they can do maths!

Our Year 3 children will be visiting Norwich Castle & Museum, following the year 3 topic in history on Ancient Egypt in school. Children will take part in learning workshops that cover what has been learnt in History last term and will be involved in hands on activities based on the topics. The children will have the opportunity to see artefacts and have experts explain why they are important in finding out about the Ancient Egyptians.

Bikeability is the government's national cycle training programme, which aims to inspire more children to cycle by equipping them with the skills and confidence to ride more. All the training is delivered by Outspoken Training's qualified trainers.

We are excited to announce Year 4, 5 and 6 will be participating in a UK wide engineering competition. This term an engineer from Siemens Energy will be visiting the children to talk about their job. The children will bring their ideas together to take part in an exciting competition on the day. If a child from our school wins, their invention will be made in real life! We look forward to enthusing the children with some STEM learning.

ACFA will be holding a Bingo session in the School Hall on Wednesday 4th February at 6pm. More details regarding this will be advertised in the community nearer the time. We are hoping this can become a regular fundraising event for our school.



HOW TO MAKE NORFOLK RUSKS



These traditional savoury rusks are simple to make, use basic ingredients you probably have already and are tasty too. Once gracing the shelves of bakeries all across Norfolk, today Norfolk Rusks are much harder to find. When stored in an airtight container they will last around a week. Served with butter and cheese they make a change from sandwiches and are a great lunchbox addition.

INGREDIENTS

225g self-raising flour
110g margarine or butter
Good pinch of salt
2 free-range eggs
A small amount of milk

METHOD

Rub together the flour and fat until you have breadcrumbs then add the salt and the well beaten egg. Use a knife to combine, add some milk until you have a dough that resembles shortcrust pastry. Roll out the dough to around an inch thick and cut into rounds with a small pastry cutter. Place on a lined baking tray and bake in fairly hot pre-heated oven 220 C or gas 7 for ten minutes until risen. Turn down to 190 C, gas mark 5 and remove rusks from the oven. Cut in half and place back in the oven rough side up to brown for around 10-15 minutes until the rusks are crisp and golden. When cold store in an airtight container and serve with butter and/or a thick slice of cheese.




