So, What Is a Local Governing Body?

Following on from the information included in our previous newsletter, Governors would like to let you know a little more about the Local Governing Body (LGB).

Local Governing Body meetings are held each half term. Six meetings a year. They are currently held on Monday evenings from 3.45pm with the meeting venue alternating between the two schools.

Meetings last about two hours.

At meetings, the Headteacher will report on progress and concerns for both schools.

Governors are a voluntary body of people who guide and support the strategic direction of the school and are members of the school team.

An LGB is a sub-committee of the Board of Trustees of DEMAT (Diocese of Ely Multi Academy Trust).

An LGB provides support to the Headteacher and their staff and provides assurance to the DEMAT Trust Board in relation to the schools.

Governance functions are delegated to the LGB by the Trustees of DEMAT and are set out in the Scheme of Delegation, a copy of which is published on the DEMAT website. There is also a link on both schools' websites.

The LGB does not make decisions about the curriculum or teaching methods.

Governors are appointed for a four-year term of office but may step down at any time during that period.

Governors attend school events and undertake monitoring visits in both schools. Monitoring for the summer term will include Safeguarding, Health & Safety at both sites, Data Protection (GDPR) and website compliance.

The LGB will also receive reports from the Subject Leaders for Early Years and Reading and Phonics.

Some Governors may take on the additional role of a Link Governor. Link Governors focus on certain areas. These include Safeguarding, SEND, Health & Safety and Wellbeing.

Details of all our current governors and their roles are available on the schools' websites.
